ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE – PARKING PROHIBITED
AT ALL TIMES ON A PORTION OF UPPER MOUNTAIN AVENUE

April 10, 2007

The Council of the Township of Montclair in the County of Essex, does ordain:

Section 1. That an Ordinance entitled: An Ordinance to regulate vehicular traffic on the streets of the Township of Montclair, in the county of Essex, Adopted May 23, 2000, be further amended and supplemented to include the following:

§ 327-16. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

SUBJECT: **TRAFFIC ORDINANCE CHANGES FOR UPPER MOUNTAIN SPEED TABLES**

The Engineering Bureau recommends the attached ordinance to prohibit parking at the intersection of Berkeley Place and Upper Mountain Avenue after investigating a complaint from a concerned citizen. Our investigation revealed that Title 39 parking restrictions do not provide adequate sight distance to allow for turns from Berkeley Place onto Upper Mountain Avenue. Accordingly, we propose the Vehicle and Traffic ordinance be changed to prohibit parking on the east side of Upper Mountain Avenue, starting at the intersection of Berkeley Place and extending south for 75 feet.
