

ORDINANCE REAPPROPRIATING \$75,000 PROCEEDS OF OBLIGATIONS NOT NEEDED FOR THEIR ORIGINAL PURPOSE IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR THE PURCHASE OF A USED FIRE TRUCK AND ADDITIONAL RELATED EQUIPMENT FOR THE TRUCK IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTCLAIR, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTCLAIR, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39, it is hereby determined that \$75,000 of the proceeds of obligations originally made available pursuant to bond ordinance #2005-40 of the Township of Montclair, in the County of Essex, New Jersey (the "Township") finally adopted September 13, 2005 is no longer necessary for the purpose of repair and improvements to various public buildings throughout the Township, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Clerk, including all work and materials necessary therefore and incidental thereto for which the obligations previously were authorized.

Section 2. The \$75,000 described in Section 1 and made available pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39 is hereby reappropriated to provide for the purchase of a used fire truck and additional related equipment for the truck, including all related costs and expenditures incidental thereto.

Section 3. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
