With the height of the COVID-19 pandemic behind us, it is not unbeknownst to most healthcare/public health professionals that everyone would like to just forget it ever happened and move on. We definitely get it. BUT, it is also very clear to us that communicable diseases as a whole still spread on a day to day basis--this includes COVID. Here's a quick update on what's been prevalent in the communicable disease side of health of recent, and what to be ready for as Fall approaches.

COVID-19 Vaccines for Fall 2024

As of August 22nd, the FDA approved and granted emergency use authorization for updated mRNA COVID-19 vaccines that corresponds to the variants most prevalent today. You can find more about the vaccine by reading the FDA press release here.

Flu Season

With fall quickly approaching, flu season will be right on its heels. The flu vaccine for 2024-2025 is available now at local pharmacies or with your primary care physicians. If you are uninsured or have Medicaid, you may qualify to receive the flu vaccine at no cost at the Montclair Health Department (children aged 11-18 or adults 19+). Please call our office to speak with a nurse about your eligibility.

West Nile Virus

West Nile virus is spread through the bite of an infected mosquito. It cannot be transmitted from person-to-person contact. According to testing results provided by the New Jersey Department of Health, mosquitos carrying the West Nile virus are present in almost every county of the state as of Aug. 21. There have been 3 confirmed cases within the state. The best way to prevent again WNV is to protect yourself against mosquito bites. Make sure anything with that can cause standing water is dumped and cleaned regularly to prevent mosquito eggs.

Food Recall: Boars Head Listeria Outbreak

In recent weeks, one of the most notable food recalls has been with Boars Head deli meat containing listeria bacteria.

- Listeriosis is especially harmful to those who are pregnant, who are immunocompromised and/or are 65 or older.

HOW HAVE OPIOIDS AFFECTED OUR COMMUNITIES?

With perpetually increasing narcotic potency, opioids impact every community throughout the country. Montclair and the greater Essex County region are certainly not immune to the national crisis. Over recent decades, New Jersey has been heavily impacted by the opioid overdose epidemic. The State Office of the Attorney General reports that from January 1, 2024, to June 30, 2024, there have been 1,010 suspected overdose deaths, 5,492 naloxone administrations, and 1,514,075 opioid prescriptions written in New Jersey. Essex county accounted for the most suspected overdose deaths of any county in NJ with 182. During the same time period, MAU responded to 16 calls dispatched as an overdose and 78 calls where drugs or alcohol were present. Furthermore, we administered naloxone 14 times, which already surpasses the total for 2023. The epidemic continues to grow in severity and scale of lives taken far too soon or left in ruin as stronger and increasingly addictive narcotics, such as fentanyl, spread. As with the COVID pandemic, we can take action to save lives and help provide resources to all those impacted by opioid and substance use disorders. The bottom line is opioid overdose deaths are preventable.

OPIOID OVERDOSE RESPONSE TRAINING PROGRAM

Supported through a grant from the Montclair **Department of Health & Human Services, MAU** is offering a free Opioid Overdose Response Training program. In this 60-90 minute course, participants will learn how to recognize the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose. how to render aid and administer naloxone. and how to keep themselves safe. Participants will also receive an Opioid Overdose Response Kit. There is no cost for the class and it is available to anyone who lives, works, or attends school in Montclair Township. Since March, MAU has taught over 200 people these important skills. We are grateful to the Montclair Department of Health and Human Services for their support and look forward to continuing to provide this vital training to the entire Montclair Township community!
