- Following the adoption of the Complete Streets ordinance, the Township has hired a Complete Streets Director Laura Torchio, AICP, who served as Chair of Montclair Vision Zero Task Force.

- What is Complete Streets? How is this different from Vision Zero? Vision Zero is a national campaign supporting the idea that Zero is only acceptable number of deaths or serious injuries on our roadways. Complete Streets is a policy and design approach that will help Montclair achieve the goal of Vision Zero. The context of the surrounding land use determines what elements of Complete Streets are most appropriate every street is different. Here's an example of South Park Street, Montclair after its redesign in 2011.

- A Complete Streets approach to roadway design can include features such as:
  - <u>Improved pedestrian infrastructure</u> like safer crosswalks, ADAcompliant accessibility upgrades, and sidewalk enhancements
  - <u>Cyclist-friendly measures</u> like bike lanes, shared-use paths, and improved signage
  - <u>Traffic calming initiatives</u> like narrowing lanes, adding curves or humps, encancing crosswalks, and lowering speed limits
- As part of the Complete Streets ordinance is the creation of a Complete Streets Oversight Board, which will consist of 9 members, composed from township staff, police department, governing body members, and members of the public.

#### 75th Anniversary of Montclair's Sister-City Relationship with Graz, Austria

2025 marks 75 years of Montclair Township's "Sister-City" relationship with the city of Graz, Austria. The city partnership began in the immediate aftermath of World War II. Montclair sent medical supplies and care packages to Austria, in addition to Mountainside Hospital providing an X-ray machine and incubator to a damaged hospital in Graz. The cultural partnership continues today, including a student exchange partnership between Montclair State University and the University of Graz.

To commemorate the anniversary, representatives from Montclair, including Deputy Mayor / Councilor-at-Large Susan Shin-Andersen and MSU President Jonathan Koppel traveled to Graz, meeting with Graz Mayor Elke Kahr, the Vice Mayor, and a Council member. 








### **Montclair Historic Preservation Commission's 2025 Award Winners**



On Thursday, June 12, the Montclair Historic Preservation Commission awarded several nominees who went above-and-beyond in preserving the unique nature of their property and the character of the greater community overall. This year, the nominees were recognized with two types of awards: the Bricks & Mortar Preservation Award and the Preservation Service Award.

The Bricks & Mortar Preservation Award recognizes nominees who demonstrate excellence in the preservation and restoration of historic buildings through compatible design and adaptive reuse.

The Preservation Service Award recognizes nominees who demonstrate outstanding achievement in furthering the aims of historic preservation within the Township, including research, planning, development, advocacy, and local community leadership.

Saving Bluestone Sidewalks - Bricks & Mortar Preservation Award
For decades, sidewalks made up of bluestone slabs have lined the streets of Montclair, increasing the aesthetic value of the streetscape and the property values of nearby homes. Montclair residents who preserved the historic slabs in front of their properties, despite the high cost of maintenance, were honored at Thursday's ceremony.



With historic roots as the former local headquarters for the Red Cross, 63 Park Street has always had strong ties to the field of medicine and healthcare. The transformation of the property into a veterinary office was honored by the Commission because the renovation was completed through adaptive reuse and continued a long-standing tradition.

Olmstead Oak - Bricks & Mortar/Adaptive Reuse Preservation Award
Tragically falling in a fierce storm in August of 2024, Anderson Park's historic
Olmstead Oak lives to see another day; this time in the form of a bench for
the public to enjoy. Local artist Charlie Spademan was honored at the
ceremony for his creation and preservation efforts.

#### Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church - Preservation Service Award



At the ceremony, the church received the Preservation Service Award both for their restoration of the building's exterior and their work with organizations like the Human Needs Food Pantry and Meals on Wheels.


Our city has officially gained access to the Dashboard, its data, and all of its features.


A message from the Office of Sustainability and Water Bureau:

## Save Water - and Money - With Digital Sprinkler Controllers

With summer temperatures rising and lawns demanding more attention, the Montclair Office of Sustainability and Water Bureau recommends that residents consider turning to digital sprinkler controllers to simplify their lawn care and conserve water.

These smart devices use real-time weather data to automatically adjust watering schedules, preventing over-watering while keeping your lawn healthy. Beyond the benefits of water conservation, they can also save residents money by reducing their utility bill. It's a simple upgrade that can make a big difference.

3<sup>rd</sup> Ward Councilor Rahum Williams recently replaced his analog sprinkler controller with a digital controller that he controls with his phone. He says: "The digital controller saves water by checking the weather forecast to see if it is necessary to water the lawn in accordance with the schedule that I programmed. It's only been about a month, but I am pretty pleased with the results because the system has skipped several watering cycles which has saved water and money."




#### <u>Vision Zero Pledge</u>
