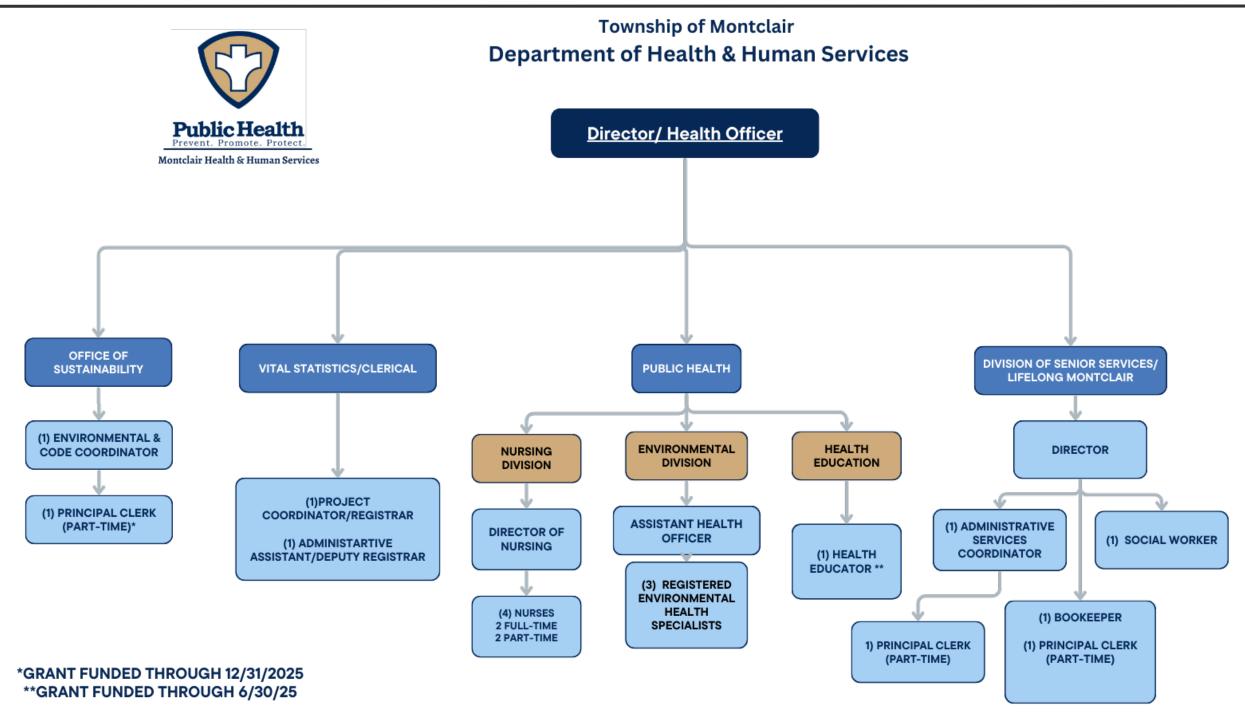

#### Senior Services 2024 data

#### In 2024, 22,012 people attended Lifelong Montclair Programs.

In-person attendance totaled **18,654**, while virtual attendance reached **3,358**.

#### 322 classes were held in 2024.

**103** MILL classes were held and **219** program events, including trips, celebrations, clubs, and other classes, occurred.

#### The majority of our senior clients reside in Montclair.

We also serve seniors from Bloomfield, Clifton, Verona, Nutley, Cedar Grove and the Oranges. Virtual Participants are from all over New Jersey and the United States.

Classes take place Monday through Friday in either Edgemont Park House, Wally Choice Community Center, or the Montclair Public Library. We also offer several courses on location at partner organizations, which can include Van Vleck Gardens, Montclair Film at The Claridge Theater, Montclair Art Museum, and the Clifton Arts Center.

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### Senior Services Transportation

Montclair Senior Services, in partnership with Essex County, offers <u>free transportation</u> services for Montclair residents aged 60 and above, as well as residents with disabilities, to meet the needs of those who are unable to safely or independently reach their destinations. Twenty free rides are available per month throughout Montclair only. Special accommodations can be provided at no cost for medical appointments and employment throughout Essex County.

Registration is required with Montclair Senior Services. Rides are provided Monday through Saturday. No reservation is needed; rides are available on demand. A cell phone is required for communication and security.
